AARN REDRESS MAP



THE BIG PAYBACK DOCUMENTARY

features FirstRepair

Erika Alexander and Whitney Dow co-directed The Big Payback, a film that chronicles the journey of reparations advocates on the local and national level. The film follows the long-running efforts of Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee as she continues the crusade for the passage of HR40, a bill to establish a national commission to examine slavery and anti-Black discrimination in America from 1619 to present. HR40 has been introduced annually in Congress for over 30 years, and the Congresswoman picks up where Congressman John Conyers left off.

The film also tracks FirstRepair's Executive Director, Robin Rue Simmons, as she leads Evanston's fight for reparations at the local level, which culminates in the passage of the first ever tax-funded reparations ordinance for Black Americans in US history. Alexander and Dow were inspired to record Robin's journey, when they flew to Evanston to meet her after hearing of the passage of Evanston's historic ordinance in 2019. They paused an earlier project documenting more general aspects of the US reparations movement and decided to continue filming Evanston's progress for the next two years. The documentary reveals "a Black woman stepping into her power and creating measurable change."

Film professional Karen McMullen stated, "With a cameo by TaNehisi Coates, this informative, insightful window into the legislative process brings with it an uplifting message championing the rights of citizens to challenge the status quo and gives needed exposure to the conversation around reparations." Viewers get a close-up look at uphill battle from visionary to strategist, educator, mediator, legislative activist. Their stories may now be familiar to FirstRepair readers, but they remain inspiring nonetheless.

The Big Payback premiered earlier this summer at the Tribeca Film Festival in New York City and will be presented next month at the Chicago International Film Festival. Click here to get tickets





GLOBAL CIRCLE FOR REPARATIONS & HEALING - VATICAN CITY

Global Circle for Reparations and Healing hosted and led a delegation of global reparations leaders, FirstRepair was humbled to be invited to join in the meeting with members of the Vatican to begin a dialog with the Catholic Church on its specific role in sanctioning and benefitting from the trans-Atlantic slave trade and the division of the Continent of Africa. The historic meeting took place as part of the Global Circle for Reparations and Healing. The Global Circle delivered a presentment, outlining the Church's leading role in the trans Atlantic slave trade, and its horrendous aftermath, and the Church's moral and legal obligation of redress."

EMBRACE IDEAS FESTIVAL - BOSTON

The Embrace Ideas Festival, hosted by King Boston which is a program of the Boston Foundation, is a yearly celebration of ideas grounded in arts, culture and public scholarship. This week-long gathering brings together local, state and national leaders to amplify anti-racism and a vision for a transformed Boston by 2030. Rooted in racial equity, healing, wellbeing, and joy, the theme of Embrace Ideas 2022 was "Building A New Boston Together".





KAIROS, CONVENING FOR THE CULTURE - MARTHA'S VINEYARD

To end the busy summer, FirstRepair addressed leaders of color in Martha's Vineyard as part of Kairos, Convening for the Culture, a three-day event organized by U.S. politician Michael Blake.



ADVANCING JUSTICE SUMMIT - ACCRA

Global Circle for Reparations and Healing in early August, hosted and led a delegation of global reparations leaders, FirstRepair was humbled to be invited to join a global coalition of diplomats, scholars, activists, artists, and civil society organizations at the Advancing Justice: Reparations and Racial Healing Summit 2022, in Accra, Ghana. The President of Ghana, His Excellency Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo delivered the keynote address and encouraged the African Union and Heads of State throughout the continent to join him in making reparations a priority. The summit culminated with the release of The Accra Declaration on Reparations and Racial Healing, a groundbreaking document to chart a new path for the reparations movement.
