O Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Partners and Friends,

This year marked three years of informing local reparations nationally, with expanded international activity and a long list of successes. Our dedicated team experienced continuous momentum, opening the year with the PBS premiere of <u>The Big Payback (now streaming on Amazon)</u>, continuing with our <u>second United Nations Permanent Forum on People of African Descent Side Event</u>, and closing the year with the <u>third Annual National Symposium for State and Local Reparations</u>. These events were three of 79 presentations we delivered throughout the year, across the country, and across the world. I am excited to share more about that work in this 2023 Annual Report.

We are fortunate to be a part of a dedicated community of reparations practitioners, activists and allies, and mission-aligned funding partners. I am grateful.

Additionally, I was invited to present to new audiences like <u>The International Downtown</u> <u>Association</u>, <u>Kilpatrick Townsend</u> and Stockton and the <u>American Institute of Architect –</u> <u>Illinois</u>, resulting in new reparations allies and partnerships. New audiences are valuable opportunities that have increased public and institutional support for Black reparations.

I am proud to report, since I led the passing of <u>the nation's first tax funded local reparations</u> <u>initiative in 2019</u>, FirstRepair has contributed to over 100 reparations initiatives. This includes 226 local leaders representing 76 unique initiatives that participated in our annual symposium November 30 - December 2, 2023, in Evanston, IL.

Here are a few additional highlights that are key in our sustainability and our movement practice:

- Reparations Toolkit and Discussion Guide
- Improved Infrastructure and Expanded Board of Directors

FirstRepair kicked off the year with a staff retreat where we set an ambitious, creative, and SMART vision for 2024, which we will achieve only with your continued partnership and support.

I remain in awe of the community of leaders we serve alongside and although there are organized efforts to halt racial redress, <u>there is promising progress and reparations is now.</u>



Informing Local Rep



The Big Payback

The Big Payback premiered on January 16, the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. holiday on PBS.

FirstRepairFounder and Executive Director Robin Rue Simmons is featured in this 88-minute documentary directed by the award-winning filmmakers, Erika Alexander, and Whitney Dow, of ColorFarm Media. This transparent and educational film continues to be an invaluable tool in advancing local reparations and enlightening viewers on the history and possibilities of reparations for the legacies of slavery in the United States.

FirstRepair presented at 26 screenings in 2023, each followed by an action-centered panel discussion with Robin RueSimmons and others. In addition to community screenings, we presented at the HBCU Reparations debate series that included screenings at each of the NC10 HBCU institutions.

Film screenings continue to be requested in local communities that are engaged in the process of reparations and continues to be an important tool to the Reparations movement. Currently, the film is streaming on Amazon Prime.







SIDE EVENT HIGHLIGHT

In May, FirstRepair partnered with the University of Pittsburgh and Columbia University, to successfully organize an official United Nations side event at the Permanent Forum for People of African Accent.

The primary focus of this event was a comprehensive exploration of various techniques and strategies needed when advocating for local reparations within the United States. Drawing on the expertise of a diverse array of presenters from across the nation, the event served as a platform for sharing valuable insights and experiences within the broader reparations movement.

The event's impact extended far beyond the borders of the United States, attracting attendees from diverse corners of the globe. This international participation not only enriched the discussions but also significantly heightened the outreach and influence of FirstRepair on a global scale.

SYMPOSIUM HIGHLIGHT

In December, FirstRepair hosted the third annual National Symposium for State and Local Reparations, welcoming 226 reparations leaders from 76 distinct reparations initiatives across the country.

Over three days, attendees engaged in sessions led by experts from across the reparations movement. These sessions covered a wide array of subjects such as legal frameworks, the intersection of arts, and strategies for community engagement.

The symposium provided attendees with knowledge, tools, and connections to continue to advance state and local reparations initiatives across the country.
